Health Enhancement Education

The Board of Trustees of Madison School District believes that the primary responsibility for family life and sex education, including moral responsibility, rests upon the home and the church and the schools can only complement and supplement those standards which are established in the family. The decision as to whether or not any program in family life and sex education is to be introduced in the schools is a matter for determination at the local district level by the local school board of duly selected representatives of the people of the community.

Health, family life and sex education, including information about parts of the body, reproduction and related topics, may be included in the instructional program as appropriate to the grade level and course of study. The instructional approach may be developed after consultation with parents and other community representatives. Instruction shall be developmentally appropriate to the grade level of the students and shall occur in a systematic manner. Parents may ask to review the materials to be used and may request that their child be excluded from sex education class sessions without prejudice.

Alcohol, Tobacco and Drug Education

The Superintendent, or his/her designee, shall develop curriculum for use in health education that provides instruction to students in the areas of prevention, education, treatment, rehabilitation and legal consequences of alcohol, tobacco and drug use.
